



Club History

The Club's origins began in LaGrange Texas where our charter members decided to start bringing back the rural agricultural heritage of the local area. A few individuals with a shared interest in old tractors, engines, and other farm equipment who decided to organize and exhibit together at local shows and events. Soon the interest grew and members shared their knowledge, experiences and resources to educate the public about our agricultural heritage.

Purpose and Activity

The Club's purpose is the preservation of antique farm equipment through the discovery, restoration, preservation, education, display, and operation of such equipment to the public at local shows and events. The Club's members share their knowledge of locating farm equipment to preserve, provide restoration techniques and locating parts, maintenance procedures, and unique operating procedures of agricultural equipment that is part of our rural heritage.

The Sharecropper's Club Members share their agricultural heritage and knowledge of the past with the generations of today and the future through;

- A. Locating and sharing information of antique tractors, engines, and other agricultural farming equipment, including locating parts.
- B. Promoting to the public and assisting in the preservation of antique agricultural equipment.
- C. Holding presentations and educational exhibitions, both individually and as a club, that promotes the agricultural history of the Texas area and the country.
- D. Making available to members and the public the dates and places of area shows and events that include antique agricultural equipment.

The Sharecropper's Antique Farm Equipment Club is a Texas nonprofit corporation that is open to anyone interested in antique farm equipment. Any person regardless of age, sex, race, religion, or disabling condition and is 18 years of age or older is eligible for membership. Membership meetings are held quarterly. The Club activities are primarily funded through its membership.
